Weight:



Bounce, consistency and feel after 2 days usage

Whilst fluffy in appearance the ball remains playable, consistent and bounces well. The balls feel much softer on the arm than Head Tour and Wilson. A softer rubber compound is used. We cut some balls to validate that.

Babolat Gold



The balls gest less fluffy that the Dunlop and Head but it loses consistency and bounce a b it quicker. The ball does not feel very harsh on the arm.

Wilson US Open



The ball does not get very fluffy, but it feels harder than the Dunlops. It feels the most pressurised and the rubber compound used is harder than the Dunlops. We cut some balls to validate that

Head Tour



The ball gets super fluffy and very heavy.
Definitely not a good ball in winter as rubber compound is harder.
Also, the ball is heavier to start with. The bounce is not very good and uniform especially in cold weather.

Dunlop AO



The ball does not get super fluffy, it bounces well it stays consistent and it uses a rubber compound which is softer on the arm than the Wilson. We cut some balls to validate that
